LONDON — Guests and nominees gathered to bear witness to the fifth annual *Art and Olfaction Awards* at *The Tabernacle*—a Grade II-listed building—in Powis Square, Notting Hill, London, England on 21 April 2018. The winners were made public during a lively and bawdy ceremony.

Awarded to just four perfumes, one experimental scent project and two special awards a year (*The Aftel Award for Handmade Perfume* and *The Contribution to Scent Culture Award*), The Art and Olfaction Awards are designed to raise public interest and awareness around new developments in independent perfumery. The Awards, established in 2014 by *The Institute for Art and Olfaction*, are given to outstanding creators in the categories of independent, artisan, and experimental perfume from across the globe, chosen for perfumes released in 2017.

The winners this year were, in the artisan category, **Chienoir** by BedeauX and **Club Design** by The Zoo; in the independent category, **Eau de Virginie** by Au Pays de la Fleur d'Oranger and **Nuit de Bakélite** by Naomi Goodsir; and the Sadakichi Award, **Under the Horizon** by Oswaldo Maciá.

In addition, two non-juried awards were presented this year. The second ever *Contribution to Scent Culture Award* was presented to legendary olfactory art practitioner **Peter de Cupere**. This year marked the first ever *Aftel Award for Handmade Perfume*, presented to **Pays Dogon** by Monsillage.

Each Art and Olfaction Award winner received *The Golden Pear*, which continues to cement its status as a prestigious achievement in the perfume world.

Continuing the tradition of holding the awards in unique locations in different perfume capitals of the world, the Tabernacle was built in 1887 as a church and converted into an arts center in the 1970s.

The evening began with a lively champagne cocktail presented by **Pochpac** in the Tabernacle, where guests were able to smell each of the finalists. When summoned into the theatre, guests were treated to samba and bossa nova by **Samba do Chapéu** UK. **Miguel Matos**, a Portugal-based journalist and experimental fragrance maker, emceed the evening with humor and grace.

Miguel Matos was joined onstage by an eclectic group of presenters, including judges Helder Suffenplan, Sarah McCartney, Denyse Beaulieu, Andy Tauer, Spyros Drosopoulos, Simon Niedenthal, Sarah Baker, Antonio Gardoni, partners Mark Loveday, Dominique Brunel, founder Saskia Wilson-Brown, and board members Maxwell Williams, Kendra Gaeta, and Julianne Lee.

The winners each gave heartfelt speeches, many of them touching on the close-knit community that has formed around independent, artisan, and experimental perfume. When receiving the Aftel Award, **Isabelle Michaud** of Monsillage invoked the spirit that permeates these annual awards: "There is a punk rock of perfumery—people who just say, '**** it, I'm going to make perfume.' And that's what these awards are about."

Returning judge for the Art and Olfaction Awards and Swiss perfumer **Andy Tauer** pointed out the tireless efforts by **Saskia Wilson-Brown** and the Institute for Art and Olfaction team. "Saskia doesn't like it when we thank her, so I will just say, 'We love you,'" said Tauer.

Finally, world-recognized fragrance journalist **Katie Puckrik** delivered a brief closing remarks, before the Institute for Art and Olfaction board member **Julianne Lee** announced that the Institute will be operating a pop-up in Amsterdam in conjunction with **Mediamatic** from 16 July 2018 to 11 August 2018.

After the awards, attendees congregated for an unofficial afterparty, where discussions about scent went deep into the night. It was a fitting end to the Awards, which began with the two-day Experimental Scent Summit on 18+19 April 2018, an important series of presentations by some of the greatest intellects working in olfactory art, organized for the second year by the Institute for Art and Olfaction in collaboration with artist **Klara Ravat**.

As with past years, our panel of esteemed judges includes luminaries from the perfume and art worlds.
